ABOUT THE TOWN

Just a few minutes' walk from the seafront and high street, The Town Mill is Dorset's 'Small Visitor Attraction of the Year' and one of the highlights of a visit to Lyme. We are a unique mix of working watermill, art galleries and creative artisans. Centred around a beautiful mediaeval cobbled courtyard, it's a great place to while away an hour or two.

MILL TOURS

Miller guided tours are free of charge, although we welcome donations to our charitable trust! Our volunteers will tell you all about the fascinating rescue and restoration of the mill, and demonstrate the giant waterwheel powering the mill as it grinds the grain. There is also our micro hydroelectric system to see.

We aim to run tours daily, 11am-4pm, dependent on volunteer availability. Please phone ahead if planning a special visit or a long journey.

HISTORY AND RESTORATION

A THOUSAND YEARS

Milling has taken place in Lyme Regis for nearly a millennia. However, the present site dates back to at least 1340, when Edward III granted a licence to The Town Mill. During the English Civil War in 1644 the mill was severely damaged. It was rebuilt shortly after, and most of the buildings you see today date from this time.

DECLINE

From the 1850s onwards, the Town Mill struggled. Cheap imported grain and improved roller-milling technology put its finances under pressure, and it eventually closed in 1926. It then lay derelict for over 60 years.

ART GALLERIES

The Town Mill is home to two thriving art galleries, The Town Mill Malthouse and The Courtyard Gallery. We host around 50 exhibitions a year, most featuring local artists from the vibrant Lyme Regis art community. Galleries are open from 10:30 to 4:30 daily.

RESCUE & RESTORATION

In 1991 the local district council announced plans to demolish the mill. Locals opposed the plans and raised over £500,000, took over the buildings and begin the restoration. Ten years later The Town Mill reopened, milling the first flour for over 70 years.

THE MILL TODAY

The Town Mill is the only volunteer-run, non-commercial mill that mills virtually every day of the year. The mill complex is a thriving arts hub, occasional entertainment venue, education and community space and home to a variety of creative small businesses. We are a registered charity (Number 104 16 14) and we welcome donations to help secure the future of the mill.

TOWN MILL STONEGROUND FLOUR

Town Mill artisan flour is unique in more ways than one. Milled by hand in our mediaeval watermill, each batch of grain is processed by one of our volunteer community, who has been trained to follow a traditional milling method.



You can purchase our delicious flour in our shop, as well as a range of baking kits, to help you create exceptional homemade bread and other bakes.

Whichever bag of flour you choose, you can be sure that your purchase benefits our charitable trust, which keeps the historic mill running. We are sure you'll enjoy the experience as much as we do.

Our range includes:

- Wholemeal flour, using strong Maris Widgeon heritage wheat from Tamarisk Farm in West Bexington, Dorset, behind Chesil Beach.
- Rye, also from cereal organically grown at Tamarisk Farm. This low-in-gluten, highly flavoured grain is excellent for people who have an intolerance to wheat.
- Spelt, using grain from the organic estate Sharpham Park near Glastonbury on the Somerset Levels, where spelt has been grown since the Bronze and Iron ages.

SPECIAL EVENTS

The Town Mill lends itself well to the variety of celebrations and festivals we host. From street theatre, dancing and musicians, to baking and art activities, you can be sure of a great atmosphere at the mill on special occasions.




WAYS & MEANS

THE PROCESS OF
IMAGE MAKING
6 - 18 April

The Morcombelake Art Group exhibition "Ways and Means: the process of image making" shows how twelve artists have worked over the last year to expand their working practice.

This has included experimenting with innovative mark making, collages, new printmaking techniques and varied approaches to drawing from life. The idea has been to push and develop each artist's repertoire and to show in the exhibition, initial ideas, sketches and experiments through to final images.



JULIE OLDFIELD

19 April - 2 May

Popular local artist Julie Oldfield returns to the Malthouse with her inventive and atmospheric mixed media paintings that have been weathered by time, the sea, oxidation and chemical treatments in order to create texture and capture coastal light and mood.



DIANA AND ACTAEON

KATE WESTBROOK

5 - 22 May



The exhibition is part of a programme curated by Deborah Wood of The Art Room especially for The Malthouse.

Following in the traditions of Classical Fine Art, and inspired by Gainsborough's watercolour study, Kate Westbrook explores the myth of Diana and Actaeon.

Written by the Roman poet Ovid and found within the collected works entitled Metamorphoses, the myth describes the fatal encounter between the hunter Actaeon and the Goddess Diana. Enraged that a mortal has seen her bathing naked, Diana splashes water upon Actaeon and he transforms into a deer and is subsequently killed by his own dogs.

Westbrook's 'Diana and Actaeon' are placed in the landscape of Dartmoor, an enthralling and inexhaustible subject she has been enjoying for a number of decades.

This current series of work represents three years of intense absorption and study, the paintings are finely rendered in oil, detailed and atmospheric, deserving of quiet contemplation.

Westbrook lives in Devon, she trained at Bath Academy of Art and Reading University and had her first solo exhibition in 1965 at the Santa Barbara Museum of Art in the USA, where she lived for a number of years after graduating. Since returning to the UK she has exhibited regularly and gained a significant reputation both as a painter and international jazz musician having joined the Mike Westbrook Band in 1974.

LYME REGIS ART SOCIETY

The annual exhibition in The Malthouse Gallery at Whitsun usually attracts over 100 works of art, offering all members a chance to display and sell their work and the public an opportunity to explore what can be achieved with a variety of media.



VIEW POINTS BRIDPORT CAMERA CLUB

7 - 20 June

Nine successful and creative photographers from Bridport Camera Club have come together to show their passion for the medium of photography.

Each has a different viewpoint on the world: whether that is expressed globally or locally; through black and white or colour; through rural or urban landscapes or the natural or the man-made world. Together they are displaying an exciting and memorable mix of work.



THERE IS ONLY LIGHT

21 - 27 June

Photographs are often seen as a representation of reality. This exhibition by **Dorset Independent Photographers** considers words penned by John Fowles, novelist and former Lyme resident, that "reality is infinitely baffling".

This is Malcolm's fourth solo exhibition at the Town Mill Galleries showcasing his dramatic larger paintings.

MARKING TIME: TRACES OF ANOTHER JURASSIC COAST

27 April - 9 May



The fossil-rich rock strata of the Jurassic period, for which the Lyme Regis coast is famous worldwide, surface again, on the other side of the SW peninsula, along the Bristol Channel coastline of West Somerset. *Marking Time* presents a diverse exhibition of work, including painting, printmaking, sculpture, textile and mixed media work, by a group of West Somerset artists responding to their own beautiful and geologically fascinating coast. The artists explore the dramatic layers and rich textures that characterise the landscape and consider underlying themes of concealment, revelation, erasure and deep time.



NIGEL SHARMAN RECENT WORK

11 - 16 May

Nigel Sharman studied Textile Design at the University of Brighton. Since leaving college in the late 80's, he has worked across several design fields both here in the UK, as well as internationally in New York and Southern Africa. However whilst his formal artistic education took place in Brighton and some of his early career took place in New York, these days he puts his real education down to, as he explains it, "being dragged round the galleries of West Penwith in Cornwall as a small boy by my father and introduced to work by Alfred Wallis and Ben Nicholson."

Whilst currently living and working primarily in London, Nigel's roots remain firmly in the South West of England, where he also regularly visits and paints, and where the distinct landscape and culture have come to be an increasing and notable influence on his work.



LANDSCAPES & SEASCAPES

MARION SAWL - 18 - 23 May

Marion studied at St. Martins School of Art, London on a part-time basis but is mainly self-taught. She has painted scenery for Gilbert and Sullivan Operatic Society and for NatWest Bank, London and has numerous paintings in collections at home and abroad.

Marion enjoys painting in acrylic and watercolour and enjoys experimenting with different media as well.

"It is a wonderful feeling to know that whatever it was that inspired me to paint a particular subject actually touched someone enough for them to purchase it. Painting is certainly a challenge and the day that I find it relaxing is the day I put down my brushes" Marion

"Knowing my Place" is an exhibition of contemporary landscape paintings by established west country artist, Lynda White.

Dorset shorelines and familiar landmarks are captured in a new series of acrylic paintings. Along with light-filled images of Devon moorland and Cornish cliffs and coves, are semi-abstract mixed media paintings. All works, whether figurative or abstract, reference specific locations and convey a compelling sense of place and season.

Paper and Clay is a diverse and exciting exhibition by five established ceramicists and a collograph printer: Linda Bristow, Cath Bloomfield, Alison Potter, Belinda Brownlee and Denise de Freitas. They met ten years ago whilst studying Ceramics at Bath Spa University. Their techniques include throwing, hand building, plaster casting and mono printing onto clay, and Cath creates collograph and stitched prints. They are all inspired to create work that is vibrant and unique.

NOSES TO THE GRINDSTONE

During the quieter winter months here at The Town Mill, our team of volunteers have not been taking it easy! With the help of professional stone-dresser Malcolm Cooper and millwright Martin Watts, a project has been undertaken behind the scenes to re-dress our peak stones, and recommission our french burr stones. As demand for our popular artisan flour range increases, we wanted to improve our production process and to be able to demonstrate an interesting additional historic milling process to our visitors. We now have an increased milling capacity and are excited to have started to develop a small-scale commercial operation, supplying larger quantities of flour to local businesses.


